

Week One (January 1st-7th)

These questions are designed to deepen your reflection on each day's readings and help you apply the lessons to your personal faith journey.

Day 1: Genesis 1-3

1. **Creation and God's Character:** How does the account of creation in Genesis 1 reveal aspects of God's character and His intentions for humanity?
2. **The Nature of Temptation:** In Genesis 3, what strategies does the serpent use to tempt Eve, and how can understanding these tactics help you resist temptation in your own life?
3. **Consequences of Disobedience:** What were the immediate and long-term consequences of Adam and Eve's disobedience, and what does this teach about the impact of sin?

Day 2: Genesis 4-7

1. **Heart of Worship:** Reflecting on Cain and Abel's offerings, what does this passage teach about the importance of the heart's posture in worshiping God?
2. **Noah's Obedience:** How does Noah's unwavering obedience to God's commands, despite societal opposition, inspire you to act faithfully in your own life?
3. **Humanity's Depravity:** What insights do these chapters provide about the progression of sin in humanity, and how does this understanding influence your view of the world today?

Day 3: Genesis 8-11

1. **God's Covenant:** In what ways does God's covenant with Noah after the flood demonstrate His mercy and commitment to creation?
2. **Pride and Its Pitfalls:** What lessons can be learned from the story of the Tower of Babel regarding human pride and the pursuit of self-glorification?
3. **Diversity and Unity:** How does the dispersion of people and the introduction of different languages at Babel affect your understanding of cultural diversity and God's plan for humanity?

Day 4: Job 1-5

1. **Faith Amidst Suffering:** How does Job's initial response to his immense suffering challenge or reinforce your understanding of faith in difficult times?
2. **Role of Adversity:** What do these chapters suggest about the role of adversity in testing and refining a person's character and faith?
3. **Counsel of Friends:** How do Job's friends' reactions to his suffering inform your perspective on providing support to others in their times of need?

Day 5: Job 6-9

1. **Expression of Despair:** In what ways does Job's candid expression of his despair and confusion before God encourage authenticity in your own prayers?
2. **Search for Understanding:** How does Job's struggle to understand his suffering reflect common human experiences, and what does this teach about seeking answers from God?
3. **God's Sovereignty:** What do these chapters reveal about God's sovereignty and the human tendency to question His justice?

Day 6: Job 10-13

1. **Honest Dialogue with God:** How does Job's willingness to voice his grievances directly to God influence your approach to communicating with Him?
2. **Misinterpretation of Suffering:** What can be learned from the misinterpretations of Job's friends regarding the reasons for his suffering?
3. **Maintaining Integrity:** In what ways does Job's determination to maintain his integrity amidst false accusations inspire you in your own faith journey?

Day 7: Job 14-16

1. **Hope in Despair:** How does Job's oscillation between hope and despair mirror the complexities of human faith during trials?
2. **Role of Comforters:** What insights do these chapters provide about the impact of words when offering comfort to those who are suffering?
3. **Perseverance in Faith:** How does Job's perseverance in seeking God, despite his profound suffering, encourage you to remain steadfast in your own faith challenges?
