# Week Three Bible Recap Discussion Questions January 15<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> (Days 15-21)

Here are three reflective questions for each day's reading from January 15th to 21st, based on The Bible Recap's chronological reading plan with Tara-Leigh Cobble.

#### Day 15: Job 40-42

- 1. **God's Sovereignty**: How does God's description of His creation, including the Behemoth and Leviathan, expand your understanding of His power and authority?
- 2. **Job's Humility**: In what ways does Job's response to God's challenge demonstrate humility and repentance, and how can you apply this attitude in your own life?
- 3. **Restoration and Forgiveness**: What does God's restoration of Job's fortunes and relationships teach about His grace and the importance of forgiveness?

# **Day 16: Genesis 12-15**

- 1. **Call of Abram**: How does Abram's obedience to God's call to leave his homeland inspire you to trust and follow God's direction in your life?
- 2. **Faith and Righteousness**: What does Abram's belief in God's promises, leading to his being counted as righteous, teach about the relationship between faith and righteousness?
- 3. **Covenant Promises**: How do God's covenant promises to Abram regarding his descendants and the land influence your understanding of God's faithfulness?

#### **Day 17: Genesis 16-18**

- 1. **Hagar's Encounter with God**: What significance does Hagar's experience of being seen by God hold for understanding His attentiveness to individual struggles?
- 2. **Promise of Isaac**: How does the promise of a son to Abraham and Sarah in their old age demonstrate God's power to fulfill His promises despite human limitations?
- 3. **Intercession for Sodom**: What can be learned from Abraham's intercession for Sodom about the role of prayer and concern for others?

#### **Day 18: Genesis 19-21**

- 1. Judgment and Mercy: How does the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah alongside the rescue of Lot illustrate the balance between God's judgment and mercy?
- 2. **Consequences of Choices:** What lessons can be drawn from Lot's choices and their impact on his family regarding the importance of godly decision-making?
- 3. **Fulfillment of God's Promises**: How does the birth of Isaac reinforce the theme of God's faithfulness in fulfilling His promises?

## **Day 19: Genesis 22-24**

- 1. **Test of Faith**: What does Abraham's willingness to sacrifice Isaac reveal about the depth of his faith and obedience to God?
- 2. **Provision of God**: How does God's provision of a ram in place of Isaac highlight His role as provider in times of testing?

### **Day 20: Genesis 25-26**

- 1. **Generational Legacy**: How do the accounts of Abraham's descendants emphasize the importance of faithfulness across generations?
- 2. **God's Covenant with Isaac**: In what ways does God's reaffirmation of His covenant with Isaac encourage trust in His promises?
- 3. **Responding to Conflict**: What insights can be gained from Isaac's responses to disputes over wells about handling conflict with patience and faith?

#### **Day 21: Genesis 27-29**

- 1. **Deception and Its Consequences**: How do the deceptive actions of Jacob and Rebekah in obtaining Isaac's blessing illustrate the complexities of family dynamics and the repercussions of deceit?
- 2. God's Presence in Uncertainty: What does Jacob's encounter with God in his dream at Bethel reveal about God's presence and promises during times of uncertainty?
- 3. **Perseverance in Adversity**: How does Jacob's service to Laban, including the challenges he faces, teach about perseverance and reliance on God's faithfulness?
