

The Bible Recap Study Questions

Day 36-42, February 5th-12th

Day 36: Exodus 19-21 (February 5th)

1. **God's Holiness at Sinai:** What does God's display of power at Mount Sinai teach about His holiness and how we approach Him?
2. **The Ten Commandments:** How do these laws reflect God's desire for His people to live distinctively as a reflection of His character?
3. **Reverence for God:** How can the Israelites' awe and fear of God at Sinai shape your understanding of worship and obedience?

Day 37: Exodus 22-24 (February 6th)

1. **Justice in God's Laws:** How do God's laws about justice and compassion reflect His care for the vulnerable and oppressed?
2. **The Covenant Confirmed:** What does the covenant ceremony in Exodus 24 teach about the significance of commitment and worship in our relationship with God?
3. **God's Presence:** How does Moses' ascent to the mountain and God's invitation into His presence inspire you to seek deeper intimacy with Him?

Day 38: Exodus 25-27 (February 7th)

1. God gives Moses detailed instructions for the Tabernacle. What does this reveal about God's desire for worship and His presence among His people?
2. The Ark of the Covenant was placed in the Most Holy Place. How does this symbolize God's holiness and His relationship with His people?
3. Why do you think God required such specific materials and dimensions for the Tabernacle, and how does this encourage obedience in your own life?

Day 39: Exodus 28-29 (February 8th)

1. The priests were set apart with special garments and consecration rituals. How does this point to the role of Jesus as our High Priest?
2. What do the priestly garments, especially the breastpiece with the names of the tribes, teach about God's care and representation of His people?
3. How does the concept of atonement in the priestly consecration process foreshadow Christ's ultimate sacrifice?

Day 40: Exodus 30-32 (February 9th)

1. The Israelites grew impatient and made the golden calf. How does this reflect the human tendency to seek quick fixes instead of waiting on God?
2. Moses intercedes for the people after their sin. What does this reveal about his character and God's mercy?
3. Despite seeing God's miracles, the Israelites still doubted Him. How can we guard against spiritual forgetfulness in our own lives?

Day 41: Exodus 33-35 (February 10th)

1. Moses asks to see God's glory, and God allows him to see only His back. What does this teach about God's holiness and our relationship with Him?
2. Why was it so important for God's presence to go with the Israelites, and how does this relate to our daily dependence on Him?
3. The Israelites brought freewill offerings to build the Tabernacle. How does this demonstrate the heart of true worship and giving?

Day 42: Exodus 36-38 (February 11th)

1. The Israelites gave so generously that Moses had to tell them to stop. What does this teach about generosity and joyful giving?
2. Each part of the Tabernacle had a purpose and meaning. How does this point to Jesus as the fulfillment of God's presence with His people?
3. Why do you think God emphasized skilled craftsmanship in the building of the Tabernacle, and how does this apply to using our gifts for His glory?
