

The Bible Recap Discussion Questions

Day 64-70, March 5th-11th

Day 64: Numbers 23–25

1. How does Balaam's obedience to God's instructions challenge you to remain faithful to God's word in difficult situations?
2. What is the significance of Balaam's prophecy about a star coming out of Jacob, and how does it point to future events in biblical history?
3. How did Israel's engagement in idolatry and immorality with the Moabites lead to severe consequences, and what lessons can you draw about remaining faithful to God amidst external temptations?

Day 65: Numbers 26–27

1. What was the purpose of the second census of Israel, and how did it prepare the nation for entering the Promised Land?
2. How does the case of Zelophehad's daughters seeking inheritance rights reflect God's justice and care for all members of the community?
3. What qualities did God see in Joshua that made him a suitable successor to Moses, and how can you cultivate similar qualities in your own leadership or service?

Day 66: Numbers 28–30

1. Why did God institute regular offerings and festivals for the Israelites, and how do these practices encourage a rhythm of worship and remembrance?
2. How does the Day of Atonement foreshadow the ultimate atonement provided through Jesus Christ?
3. How does the emphasis on keeping vows highlight the importance of integrity and accountability in your commitments to God and others?

Day 67: Numbers 31-32

1. How does Israel's battle against the Midianites demonstrate God's judgment against sin, and what does it teach about obedience to His commands?
2. What was the purpose of purifying the spoils of war, and how can you apply principles of purification and dedication in your own life?
3. How did the request of the tribes of Reuben and Gad to settle east of the Jordan River test their commitment to the community?

Day 68: Numbers 33–34

1. How does the detailed recounting of Israel's journey emphasize the importance of remembering God's guidance and faithfulness in your own life journey?
2. What warnings did God give about coexisting with the inhabitants of Canaan, and how do they apply to avoiding influences that can lead you away from God today?
3. How does the specific allocation of the Promised Land among the tribes reflect God's order and provision, and what does it teach about trusting His plans for your life?

Day 69: Numbers 35–36

1. What was the purpose of the Levitical cities, and how does providing for those who serve God full-time apply to supporting spiritual leaders today?
2. How do the cities of refuge illustrate God's justice and mercy, and how can you embody these attributes in your interactions with others?
3. How did the resolution regarding the inheritance of Zelophehad's daughters balance individual rights with tribal integrity, and what does it teach about seeking solutions that honor both personal and community well-being?

Day 70: Deuteronomy 1–2

1. How does Moses' recounting of Israel's history serve as a reminder of God's faithfulness, and how can reflecting on your own spiritual journey strengthen your trust in Him?
2. What were the consequences of Israel's lack of trust in God's promise regarding the Promised Land, and how can you cultivate a heart that trusts God's promises even when facing challenges?
3. How does God's instruction to Israel to respect the territories of Edom, Moab, and Ammon teach us about respecting boundaries and trusting God's timing?
