

Bible Recap Discussion Questions

April 16th-22nd, Day 106-112

Day 106: Psalm 56, 120, 140–142

1. How does David express both his fear and his trust in God in Psalm 56? How can you apply this in your own struggles?
2. What do these psalms teach about crying out to God in distress while also praising Him?
3. How does David's confidence in God's justice and deliverance encourage you in difficult times?

Day 107: 1 Samuel 25–27

1. What does Abigail's wisdom and humility in dealing with David and Nabal teach about peacemaking and trusting God?
2. How does David's decision to spare Saul's life again (1 Samuel 26) show his commitment to God's authority rather than taking matters into his own hands?
3. Why do you think David sought refuge with the Philistines in 1 Samuel 27, and what does this reveal about his faith journey?

Day 108: Psalm 17, 35, 54, 63

1. How does David's plea for justice in these psalms reflect both his struggles and his confidence in God's righteousness?
2. In Psalm 63, David declares that God's love is "better than life." How does this challenge your perspective on what truly satisfies?
3. How do these psalms teach us to seek God's presence, even in the midst of trials?

Day 109: 1 Samuel 28–31; Psalm 18

1. What does Saul's decision to consult a medium in 1 Samuel 28 reveal about the consequences of ignoring God's guidance?
2. How does David's response to personal loss in 1 Samuel 30 differ from Saul's response to difficulty?
3. In Psalm 18, David praises God for being his rock and deliverer. How does this psalm reflect God's faithfulness in your own life?

Day 110: 2 Samuel 1–4

1. How does David's lament for Saul and Jonathan in 2 Samuel 1 reveal his character and trust in God's timing?
2. What do the conflicts between David's men and Saul's remaining followers in these chapters teach about patience in waiting for God's promises?
3. How do we see God working through both victories and hardships in David's rise to the throne?

Day 111: Psalm 6, 8–10, 14, 16, 19, 21

1. How do these psalms show the contrast between the righteous who trust in God and the wicked who reject Him?
2. Psalm 19 highlights how God reveals Himself through creation and His Word. How does this deepen your appreciation for Scripture?
3. How does Psalm 16 reflect the joy and security that come from trusting in God alone?

Day 112: 2 Samuel 5–7; 1 Chronicles 17

1. How does David's desire to bring the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem reflect his heart for worship?
2. What does God's covenant with David in 2 Samuel 7 teach about His faithfulness and long-term plans?
3. How does David's response to God's promises in 1 Chronicles 17 model humility and gratitude?
