

## **Bible Recap Discussion Questions**

### **April 2<sup>nd</sup>-April 8<sup>th</sup>, Days 92-98**

#### **Day 92: Judges 8–9**

1. How does Gideon's response after his victory (Judges 8) reveal both faithfulness and potential pitfalls of leadership?
2. What lessons can we learn from Abimelech's rise and fall about the dangers of pride and self-exaltation?
3. How does the cycle of Israel's sin and God's judgment remind you of the importance of staying faithful to Him?

#### **Day 93: Judges 10–12**

1. Why do you think the Israelites continued to turn to idols, despite experiencing God's deliverance multiple times?
2. What does Jephthah's story teach us about making rash vows and trusting in God's grace rather than our own words or actions?
3. How does God's use of unlikely leaders in this section encourage you about His ability to use anyone for His purposes?

#### **Day 94: Judges 13–15**

1. What does Samson's birth story teach us about God's plans for individuals even before they are born?
2. How do Samson's weaknesses (especially his lack of self-control) serve as a warning for us in our own struggles?
3. Despite Samson's flaws, how do we see God working through him to accomplish His purposes?

**Day 95: Judges 16–18**

1. How does Samson’s downfall reveal the dangers of relying on personal strength instead of God’s power?
2. What do we learn about God’s grace and redemption from the way Samson’s life ends?
3. How do the events in Judges 17–18 show what happens when people do what is right in their own eyes rather than follow God?

**Day 96: Judges 19–21**

1. How does the disturbing story in Judges 19–21 reflect the deep moral corruption that comes from rejecting God’s authority?
2. What does this section teach about the dangers of doing what is “right in your own eyes” rather than following God’s commands?
3. Even in the midst of Israel’s chaos, how do we see God’s sovereignty and justice at work?

**Day 97: Ruth 1–4**

1. How does Ruth’s loyalty to Naomi demonstrate faithfulness and trust in God’s plan?
2. What do Boaz’s actions teach about kindness, integrity, and being a redeemer?
3. How does the book of Ruth show God’s providence in working through ordinary people to fulfill His greater plan?

**Day 98: 1 Samuel 1–3**

1. What do Hannah’s prayers and her willingness to give Samuel back to God teach us about surrendering our desires to Him?
2. How does God’s calling of Samuel in 1 Samuel 3 show the importance of listening to His voice?
3. What does Eli’s failure to discipline his sons teach us about the responsibility of spiritual leadership?
